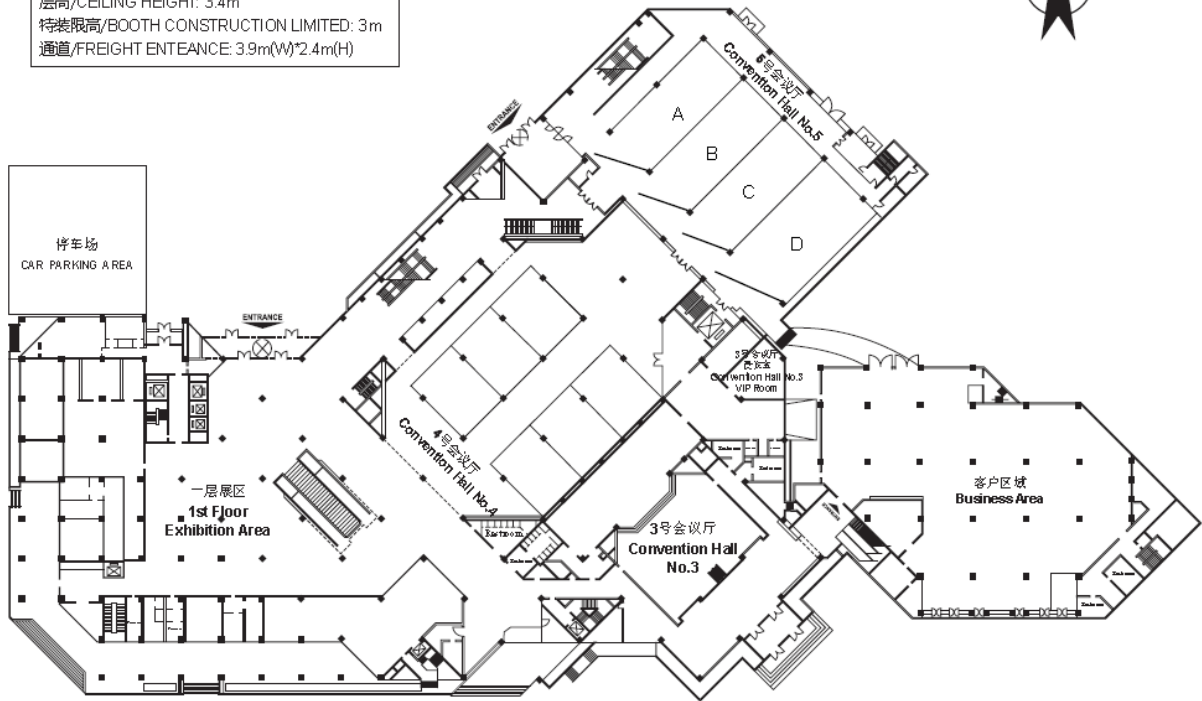

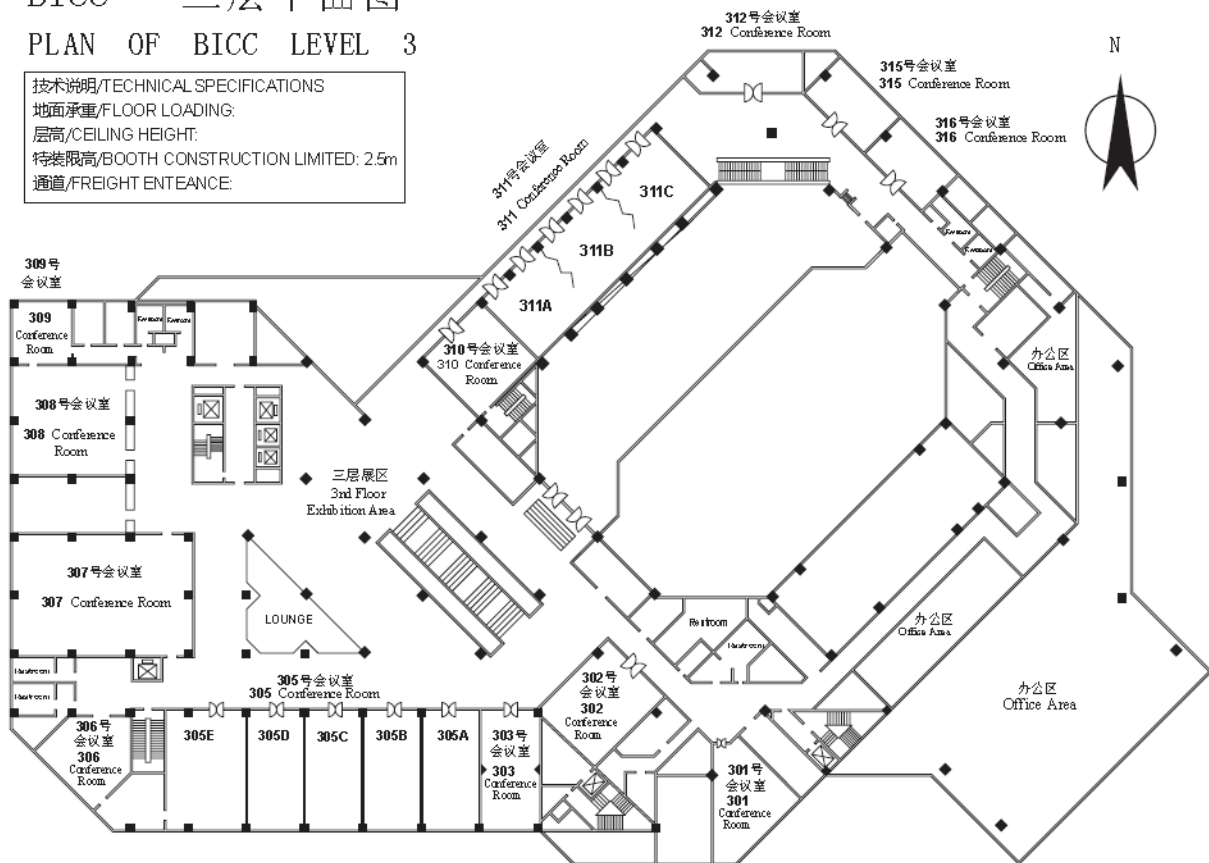
BICC 一层平面图

**Keynote Speaker****Chinese Entrepreneurs, Social Networks, and Guanxi**

**Ronald Burt**

Hobart W. Williams

Professor of Sociology and Strategy

Booth School of Business

University of Chicago

Professor Burt's work describes social networks creating advantage. Applications focus on personal networks and the network structure of markets. In addition to computer software and articles in research journals, Professor Burt's last three books are the one that proposed the concept of structural holes, *Structural Holes: The Social Structure of Competition* (1992, Harvard University Press), a broad review of links between network structure and performance, *Brokerage and Closure: An Introduction to Social Capital* (2005, Oxford University Press), and argument and evidence on the substantial extent to which network advantage depends on the person at the center of the network, *Neighbor Networks: Competitive Advantage Local and Personal* (2010, Oxford University Press, which received the 2011 Academy of Management George R. Terry Book Award for the work that most advanced management knowledge in the last two years). Research and teaching materials can be downloaded at <http://faculty.chicagobooth.edu/ronald.burt>.

Professor Burt's college work at Johns Hopkins University included pre-medical training, physiological psychology, and behavioral science. He graduated from the University of Chicago with a Ph.D. in sociology, then was on the faculty at the University of California Berkeley, SUNY Albany, and Columbia University before returning to join the University of Chicago faculty in 1993. In 1999, he began a leave of absence to learn more about European business as the Shell Professor of Human Resources at INSEAD. In 2000, he began a leave of absence to learn more about practical implementation as the Vice President of Strategic Learning in Raytheon Company. He continues today at the University of Chicago.

## Chinese Network for Social Network Studies

### 中国社会学会社会网与社会资本研究专业委员会

Chinese Network for Social Network Studies (in brief, CNSNS) is a voluntary organization of Chinese network theorists. Its purposes aim at promoting Network Theories and Social Network Analysis in China and developing network theories suited for Chinese society. The preparatory office has been set up for organizing a series of activities at Jan. 17th 2007. It has held four "Social Network Studies and Relationship Management Conference(s)" separately in Shanghai, Harbin, Nanjing and GuangChou. In addition, the association also helped editing several special issues of social network studies for Chinese journals, and organized five training programs of social network analysis.

Chinese always describe themselves as a "Ren-Qing society", that is, roughly saying, a society built upon social ties (guanxi) and favor exchanges. Guanxi, guanxi network, favor exchange, guanxi circle and self-organization are the most important concepts to analyze Chinese society. Social network theories and network analysis exactly provide the best tools for these analyses. Therefore, many young scholars and graduate students tried to learn the relevant theories and methods. A group of network theorists in China has worked hard to promote the studies in this area, and CNSNS becomes the platform for these programs. In addition, a series of academic activities were organized for developing network theories specially suited for China. Since Chinese society provides abundant data for networking behaviors, we wish these efforts will enrich social network theories.

社会网理论(Network Theory)自 Harrison White 建立此一研究观点及方法后, 历经第二代弟子如 Mark Granovetter, Scott Boorman 以及 R.L.Breiger 等人五十多年经营, 至本世纪初已被美国社会学界誉为与新制度论、理性选择学派鼎足而三的显学。社会网理论视社会结构为一群人或组织的社会网连结, 不同于过去社会学多视社会为不同族群的组合, 此一新分析观点配合上网络分析、统计方法以及随机模型等相关数学的发展, 其实证的方法论基础在社会学中尤显扎实, 故能在日渐讲求科学实证的社会学内成为一代显学, 也必将引领未来社会学的走向。

网络理论及分析方法的应用层面很广, 早期的研究有新产品的传播、传染病的扩散、社会支持、情感支持、心理咨商、婚姻配对以及劳力市场中找职过程等等, 后来的研究则增加了很多经济现象, 如消费行为、网络式组织、经济制度、组织行为的研究等。八零年代以后, 网络研究由社会学而进入商学领域, 遂蔚为一时之盛, 成为各主要研究大学商学院的新领域, 尤其以芝加哥大学之 R. Burt 为然。

近年社会网研究在国内社会学界及管理学界也渐渐蔚为风气, 并与复杂网、动态网及大数据结合, 发展到传媒学、计算机学与物理学者之中, 研究同仁日渐增多, 写出相当多精彩论文, 面对此蓬勃发展的气象, 可惜国内尚缺一学会有计划地收集同仁们的论文以及网络分析数据的数据库, 使相关学者、学生可以便捷地取得社会网研究之资源, 并收到相互讨论切磋之效。

有鉴于此, 中国社会学会社会网与社会资本研究专业委员会遂成立, 以收整合资源且促进研究同仁交流之功效。本委员会是由清华大学、南京大学、中山大学、上海大学、哈尔滨工业大学、南京理工大学、华东理工大学、华南理工大学等诸多社会网学人发起的全国性的专业学术研究组织。2006 年委员会开始筹备, 2009 年 7 月于上海正式成立。

委员会秉承自组织、自治理的志愿者精神, 以社会网及社会资本学术研究为纲, 团结了社会学、管理学、传播学、复杂网络、计算机研究等多类学科的学者, 到 2017 年共举办了十二次中国社会学年会社会网与社会资本研究的分论坛, 独立举办十三届社会网与关系管理研究年会, 在中国本土社会学研究、管理学研究中产生重大影响。

## Center for Social Network Research at Tsinghua University

### 清华大学社会网络研究中心

The Tsinghua Center for Social Network Research was founded on Jan. 1st 2013. As a Tsinghua University research center, its purpose is to develop a platform for cooperation among physicists, computer scientists, and social, behavioral and epidemiology researchers, so that they can explore a set of interdisciplinary methodological approaches for studying complex social networks in big data.

Big data brings a lot of opportunities and challenges for interdisciplinary research: Various domains of knowledge have developed and accumulated a large body of hypotheses, models and empirical findings on the structure, dynamic processes, and consequences of social networks.

In order to arrive at a consensus we first need to create a methodological framework that takes data mining as its starting point. The object of research is online big data, which has the untapped potential to yield findings about new social phenomena. The next step is interpreting these findings through various qualitative and survey studies, which will further help us reveal grounded truth to verify theoretical hypotheses. The final step is building a model that encompasses the co-evolution of human actions and network structure based on the operative theories. With a model built on this solid foundation, researchers trained with interdisciplinary methods have the required information to predict new facts from their results.

Running in parallel to our research are real-world surveys that often generate new facts that conflict with our interpretation of the results of data mining. In this kind of scenario, we must return to our data and begin an iterative process of data mining, theory development and dynamic model building; until we can reconcile the two sets of results.

清华大学社会网络研究中心（CSNR）成立于 2013 年 1 月 1 日。作为清华大学的研究中心，其目的是建立平台推进物理学、计算机科学和社会科学研究者之间的合作，以利彼此探索跨学科方法。

为了有效整合数据挖掘、理论建构与动态复杂系统的预测，中心创建一个以数据挖掘为出发点的方法论框架，以在线大数据为挖掘对象，发现新社会现象，通过各种定性和调查研究，解释这些发现，进而揭示社会实际情况，并验证理论假说。在被验证的理论基础上建立包括人类行动和网络结构的共同演化模型。通过跨学科的方式建立动态网络模型，从而预测社会系统非线性演化的轨迹，并对非线性发展的社会系统中涌现的新生社会现象有所解释与预测。

CSNR 的目标是推进一系列项目，用以培养不同研究背景的学生，让他们不同的专业领域在方法上和实质上交流、整合并相互印证发明。依靠这样的跨学科培训学生以及联合研究的方法，做出大数据领域的新发现以及社会网络研究方面的大进展。

Institute for Empirical Social Science Research at Xi'an Jiaotong University

## 西安交通大学实证社会科学研究所

Established in October 2009, the Institute for Empirical Social Science Research (IESSR) at Xi'an Jiaotong University has been aimed to promote theoretically-informed and empirically-based social science research, with a focus on social network analysis and the sociology of guanxi through which to observe and explain the changing social realities of contemporary Chinese society. Since its founding, the IESSR has organized summer schools on social science research methods, a Wednesday seminar series, created and maintained a public data archive on topical social surveys, and built a research platform for Chinese and international researchers. In July 2013, IESSR successfully held the INSNA International Conference, which attracted about 500 scholars and students from 23 countries and regions to attend.

IESSR now has one University Leading Professor (Yanjie Bian, IESSR founding director), three Changjiang-Scholar Distinguished Professors (Shenyang Guo, Yaojun Li, Zai Liang), one Young Talent Scholar (Jun Liu), and 40 research fellows on its research faculty, who actively work with 40 graduate research assistants and consult with 20 domestic and international advisors on board. In recent years, IESSR research fellows have received four major project grants and a dozen individual grants from China's national social science foundation, one major project grant from Shaanxi Provincial Social Science Foundation, and a few internationally collaborative grants. One of the current efforts of the IESSR is to study the positive and negative impacts of social networks on career outcomes through the Job-Search Network Project, known as JSNET project.

西安交通大学实证社会科学研究所（实证所）成立于 2009 年 10 月，其宗旨是推动理论导向的实证社会科学研究，主攻学术研究方向为社会网络分析和关系社会学研究，由此把握中国社会现实及其变动。建立至今，实证所每年举办社会科学研究方法暑期学校，举办周三午间工作坊，组织大型专题社会调查并建立公共数据库，并致力于打造国际知名、全国一流的社会科学研究平台。实证所于 2013 年 7 月在西安成功举办了“社会网络分析世界大会”，来自 23 个国家和地区的约 500 学者和学生前来参加。

实证所目前拥有西安交大领军学者 1 人（边燕杰，创所所长）、长江学者 3 人（郭申阳、李姚军、梁在）、青拔拔尖学者 1 人（刘军），以及研究员 40 人、硕博研究生研究助理 40 人、中外学术顾问 20 人。实证所研究员近年获得国家社科重大和重点项目 4 项、陕西省社科重大项目 1 项、国家和教育部社科一般项目 10 余项、国际合作项目若干。目前，实证所正在开展求职网络的追踪调查（JSNET），研讨社会网络对于职业生涯的正负因果效应。

## School of Social Sciences Tsinghua University

# 清華大學社會科學學院

1911年清华学堂（1912年改称清华学校）建立之初，便开设多门政治学、经济学课程。1925年清华学校设立大学部。1926年成立的17个学系就包括社会学系、政治学系、经济学系和教育心理学系。1928年清华学校改名国立清华大学，设文、理、法三个学院共15个学系，其中社会学系、心理学系分别归入文学院和理学院，政治学系和经济学系隶属法学院。

清华大学社会科学的发展秉承“中西融会、文理会通”的学术传统，倡导运用现代科学的思想 and 研究方法探讨政治、经济和社会现象，坚持学习借鉴国际社会科学的先进经验和国际学术标准，注重研究中国现实问题，以“民族在学术上之独立发展，而完成建设新中国之使命为宗旨”，在治学和人才培养方面取得了世所公认的杰出成就。

一大批学术造诣深厚、社会影响广泛的杰出学者和社会活动家曾在清华社会科学各学系执教或学习，如费孝通、陈岱孙、张奚若、潘光旦、钱端升、萧公权、王铁崖、王亚南、陈达、朱君毅、伍启元、赵元任、戴世光、萧蓬、吴景超、李景汉、陈体强、唐钺等。以他们为代表的清华社会科学师生不但引领科学研究风气之先，而且学以致用，成为中国现代政治、经济和社会建设的一代英才。

1952年全国高等教育院系调整，清华大学成为多科性工业大学。社会科学相关学系和师生并入其他院校或学术机构。20世纪80年代之后，清华大学逐步向综合性大学方向发展，相继复建社会科学学科。1984年清华大学成立社会科学系，1993年成立人文社会科学学院，下设哲学与社会学系、中国语言文学系、历史系、思想文化研究所、科学技术与社会研究所、经济学研究所、教育研究所和艺术教育中心。1997年人文社会科学学院成立国际关系学系。2000年复建社会学系和政治学系。2008年复建心理学系。2012年，在清华新百年的起始之年，清华大学在原人文社会科学学院基础上，分别成立人文学院和社会科学学院。社会科学学院下设政治学系、国际关系学系、社会学系、心理学系、经济学研究所、科学技术与社会研究所，旨在瞄准国际学术前沿和国家战略需求，再创清华大学社会科学新的辉煌。

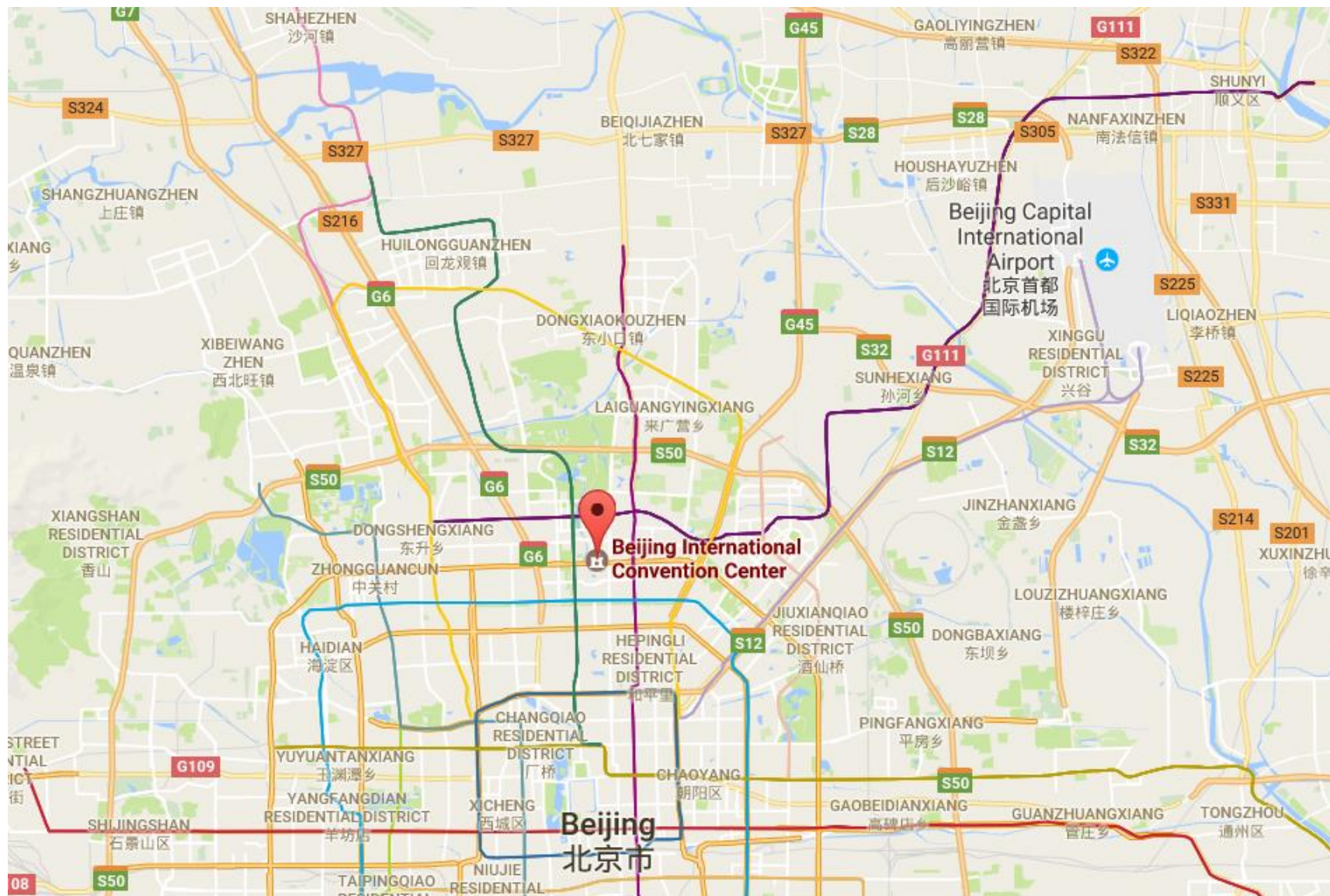
社会科学学院的主干学科是：政治学、社会学、经济学、心理学，目前有5个博士学位授予权的一级学科：政治学、社会学、理论经济学、体育学、哲学。4个本科专业：社会科学实验班（含国际政治学、社会学、经济学专业方向）、心理学专业；4个博士后流动站：政治学、社会学、理论经济学、哲学；3个北京市重点学科：国际关系、社会学、科学技术与社会。《国际关系分析》、《马克思主义政治经济学原理》、《邓小平理论与“三个代表”重要思想概论》课程被评为国家级本科精品课。

学院现有教职工83人，其中教授45人，副教授25人，讲师11人，职员2人，在站博士后67人。目前在读学生总数862人，其中本科生358人，硕士研究生281人，博士研究生223人（含留学生151人、港澳台学生13人）。

学院下设4系（政治学系、国际关系学系、社会学系、心理学系）2所（经济学研究所、科学技术与社会研究所），还设有近20个跨学科非实体研究机构。

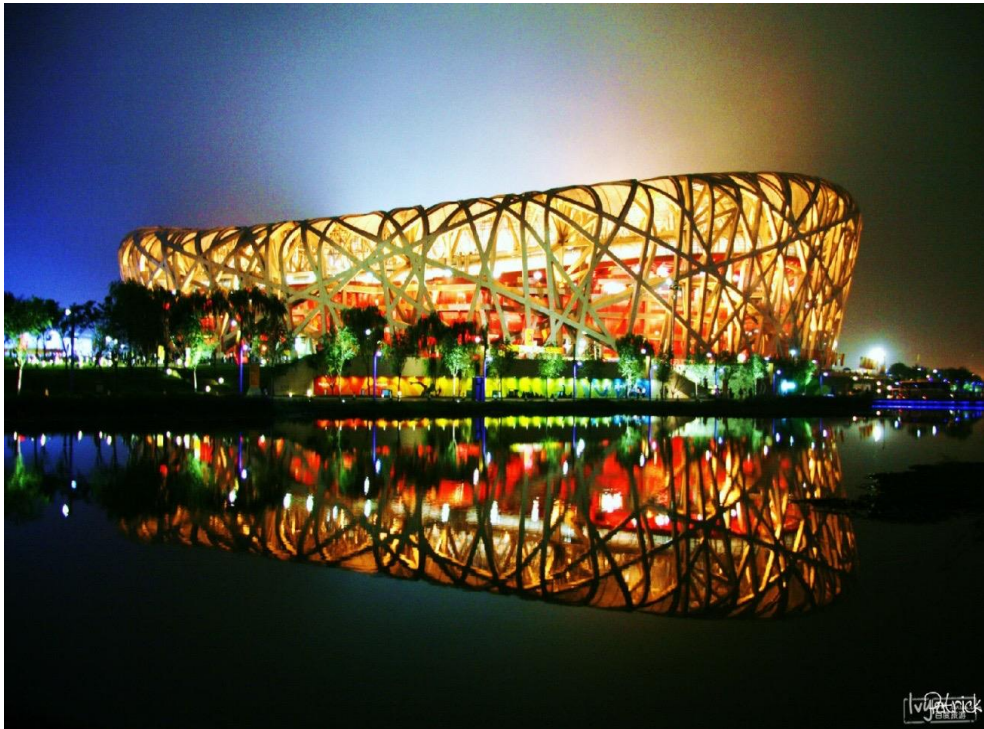
